Written by Joyce Bowden OAM, one of the founders of Bindi Enterprises, and Anne McNamara, the book celebrates the achievements of the people it supports and demonstrates what can be achieved when people with a shared vision work together to provide meaningful pathways for local people with disability.

NDIS Updates

New South Wales

New South Wales' Community Justice Program (CJP) has been providing a high-level of specialised support to people with intellectual disability who have a history of offending.

CJP services continue to transition to the NDIS and Lifestyle Solutions has been working with the NDIA and FACS to support this transition in the best interests of customers and the community.

FACS continue to provide some clinical and financial support for relevant participants who require supported accommodation where their supports are related to community safety requirements.

We continue to work towards the transition of our Child & Family Out Of Home Care services to the Intensive Therapeutic Care Model now required by FACS. As part of this work, it has been identified that accessing NDIA funding is critical in ensuring children in care are receiving the full benefit of available funding to meet their disability needs.

Western Australia

Western Australia commenced transferring to the national NDIS model on 1 April 2018 with the original schedule to be completed by December 2018. Whilst not on schedule, this includes multiple metropolitan sites as well

as the following regional areas: Lower South West, Kimberley, Pilbara and the Wheatbelt.

Lifestyle Solutions has been part of a working group with Western Australia disability service organisations and the NDIA looking at a 'Flexible Individualised Living Funding' mechanism and quoting tool.

This mechanism will allow for models of support that don't fit individualised support and 24 hour supported accommodation to be funded by the NDIA. An example of this is shared living options which are currently being operated by a number of other service providers.

Northern Territory

The NDIS roll-out is in full swing in the Northern Territory with many of our customers finishing their first plan and entering into the review process for their second plan.

We're also working on ways to utilise the opportunities the NDIS presents in remote locations and using creative service models and options.

Queensland

The roll-out of the NDIS in South East Queensland commenced on 1 July 2018 and, with daily intakes occurring, it's now gaining significant momentum and growth.

The NDIS will be rolling out on the Sunshine Coast from 1 January 2019 and this is currently a focus for our team in that area.

We had a great opportunity to engage with potential support workers at a recent Job Expo in Redland Bay. It's great to see so many people interested in pursuing a career in the industry.

Demand is high for a new location for a short-term accommodation (respite) centre. We look forward to announcing the new location in a future update.

Tasmania

We are now commencing the final phase of the roll-out of NDIS services across Tasmania with completion expected in June 2019.

Our team is currently focussing on short-term accommodation and support coordination and expanding on our specialist services.

Victoria

We're pleased to announce that on 2 January 2019 we will be providing a centre-based activities hub in Victoria for children and young people.

The service is a NDIS funded program designed to support the individual needs of children and young people in our care. It focusses on capacity

building, individual support and support coordination.



Lifestyle Solutions wins two Mayoral Awards

Celebrated annually on 3 December for International Day of People with Disability is the Alice Springs Town Council Mayoral Awards. The Mayoral Awards highlight the contributions made by individuals with disability and by individuals for disability communities.

Two people from Lifestyle Solutions, one of our board members and one of our valued customers, were recognised for making a significant difference to society.

Bindi Mwerre Anthurre Artist and Lifestyle Solutions customer, Adrian Robertson, won the Noteworthy Award for his important contribution to the community. Adrian bridges the gap between disability and mainstream art and has been recognised for several achievements this year, including representing Alice Springs as a finalist in the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Awards.

Adrian was also a finalist for Alice Springs' national contemporary art award, the Alice Prize, and held a solo exhibition at Raft Artspace in Alice Springs called Paint Country. Adrian's growing public profile and increased access to his work highlight his creative influence and positive contribution to the Alice Springs community.

For 21-year-old, Newcastle local, Chris, the ongoing daily support he receives from Lifestyle Solutions has meant that not only can he now live more independently but he has overcome his immense fear of water.

Chris, who requires substantial support, came into Lifestyle Solutions' care over two years ago.

Tina Keating, Facilitator with Lifestyle Solutions said, "When Chris first started supports with us he was very afraid of water. He disliked the

showering, swimming and even drinking water was very difficult for him."

"Chris also found environments such as shopping centres and supermarkets very stressful and had trouble heading out into the local community on his own," said Tina.


With the ongoing encouragement and

guidance of his support workers, Chris is now enjoying much more independence and quality of life.

"Because of the continuity of his care, Chris is now making some big strides in his personal development. By building strong relationships with his staff, Chris now feels safe and is able to go swimming, shower on his own and even enjoy a drink of water," said Tina.

Chris' dad, Colin, said Chris will now happily go to the supermarket with the assistance of his support workers, pick items from a shopping list and use the self-serve checkout.

"The staff at Lifestyle Solutions have been invaluable to my son and I and they're always happy to assist us whenever we need them. Chris' support workers have been amazing. Chris would not be where he is today, and I would not be where I am, without the support of Lifestyle Solutions." said Colin.



James' new positive outlook on life

Since coming onboard with Lifestyle Solutions' disability support services five years ago, West Australian local, James, is now enjoying a more active and stable lifestyle.

Maintaining routines, medical treatments and a healthy lifestyle had previously been a challenge for James but, with ongoing daily support from his staff at Lifestyle Solutions, his health, wellbeing and social skills have greatly improved.

Rajesh, Senior Support Worker at Lifestyle Solutions said, "When James first came into our care he was reluctant to engage in conversations and would isolate himself from others"

"The quality, commitment and consistency of his Support Workers has been key to the significant improvement in the quality of James' life," said Rajesh.

Opper, Support Worker at Lifestyle Solutions said "By actively engaging James in meaningful everyday activities his attitude has become very positive."


With ongoing daily support and encouragement to followup on medical treatments, James is now able to enjoy an increased level of independence and actively participates in activities such as fishing, shopping, bowling, golf, going to the gym, movies and swimming.

James now regularly helps his housemates by doing household chores like making his bed, washing dishes and doing laundry and takes pride in his appearance and personal care.

"We're so proud of how far James has come in terms of his personal development. He's re-established his family connections, enjoys spending time with the other participants and staff, and actively participates in conversations, household chores and outdoor activities," said Opper.

James is thriving which is reinforced by feedback from his family and other professionals and his outlook on life has greatly improved.

"The commitment, genuine care and interest shown by staff at Lifestyle Solutions has created a supportive environment where James feels safe and valued, resulting in improved outcomes for his overall health," said Rajesh.

Through its Adult Day Program, the Port Stephens Community Hub's dedicated team help our customers develop friendships, skills and confidence to pursue interests and community connections.

Lifestyle Solutions' Community Support Worker, Kelly Riding, facilitated the volunteer program now affectionately known as, *Lifestyle Buddies* and it's proven to be a huge success for the students and our customers.

Once a month, five participants at the Hub volunteer at Anna Bay Public School's Year 1 class, assisting with maths class activities.

Kelly said the program has been successfully running for three years and both the students and volunteers really look forward to the day.

"The benefits for the people we support have been immense and they're now confident enough to develop and present their own programs with the students. We also incorporate travel training into the day where customers can learn about reading timetables, familiarising themselves with local transport routes and using their Opal Card to get to and from the school," said Kelly.

Mrs Allan, Year 1 Teacher at Anna Bay Public School said, "The participants and students have been able to work together and form many positive partnerships. There is a strong focus on developing empathy and tolerance, which are the keystones for successful teamwork and healthy relationships."
